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MONEYSHOW.COM SENTIMENT INDICATOR REVEALS UK INVESTORS & TRADERS BULLISH

54% Believe the FTSE 100 Will Rise from Now Until the End of 2010

LONDON, 30 October 2009 – MoneyShow.com, a multimedia online community for investors and traders, will announce the results of the first ever UK Sentiment Indicator tomorrow at The World MoneyShow in London at the QEII Convention Centre. The results revealed that over 53% are bullish about the FTSE 100, with 22% predicting increases of 10% or greater between now and the end of 2010.

Hard commodities and emerging stock markets were identified as the asset classes respondents think will perform best until the end of 2010. Over 46% predicted inflation will increase while nearly 42% expect it to remain constant.

Nearly 41% polled believe the residential property market will hit its lows in 2010, while 26% believe prices will hit bottom after 2010, and 25% think the lows have been reached. Meanwhile, 44% believe global equity markets won't make big moves either way for some time, 32% indicated we are in a bear market rally, and 23% think global equities are in a bull market.

The Sentiment Indicator polled 244 investors and traders between 21 – 27 October, 2009. The respondents are MoneyShow.com members and those who have registered for MoneyShow conferences that live in the United Kingdom. Questions asked include the outlook for the FTSE, best performing asset classes, and inflation from now until the end of 2010, in addition to questions about the end of the recession, residential property markets, global equity markets, party expected to win the next general election, and taxes.

The site commissions several other indicators throughout the year among investors and traders in the United States with the results announced in conjunction with its various trade
